- Take a motorcycle safety course. Consult the Motorcycle Safety Foundation's Web site for a listing of courses in your state, or contact your local Chamber of Commerce.
- Ride a bike that is appropriate for your skill level. Bikes with 125 – 250 ccs are recommended for beginners.
- Consider three-wheel bike styles for added stability on the road. Manufacturers are coming out with three-wheel options like the CanAm™ Spyder™.
- Reduce your speed in wet conditions. Wet pavement means longer stopping time.
- Make sure your bike is running properly before getting on the road.
- Wear protective gear when you're riding your bike including a helmet, jacket, eyewear, long pants and boots.
- Stay aware of what other drivers on the road are doing. Scan around you, in front, to the side and behind. Be aware of cars waiting to turn left across your path at intersections. Always avoid another vehicle's blind spot.
- Always carry a cell phone when you ride. Let someone know where you're going and when you plan to arrive at your destination.
- Pay attention to prescription drug warnings. Avoid riding your bike if you are taking medication that causes drowsiness or slows your reaction time.
